

# Optocoupler, Phototriac Output, High dV/dt, Low Input Current

### DESCRIPTION

The VO4256 phototriac consists of a GaAs IRLED optically coupled to a photosensitive non-zero crossing TRIAC packaged in a DIP-6 package.

High input sensitivity is achieved by using an emitter follower phototransistor and a cascaded SCR predriver resulting in an LED trigger current of 1.6 mA for bin D, 2 mA for bin H, and 3 mA for bin M.

The new non zero phototriac family use a proprietary dV/dt clamp resulting in a static dV/dt of greater than 5 kV/ $\mu s.$ 

The VO4256 phototriac isolates low-voltage logic from 120  $V_{AC}$ , 240  $V_{AC}$ , and 380  $V_{AC}$  lines to control resistive, inductive, or capacitive loads including motors, solenoids, high current thyristors or TRIAC and relays.




Fig. 1 - Recommended Operating Condition




Fig. 2 - Diode Forward Voltage vs. Forward Current





Fig. 3 - Diode Reverse Voltage vs. Temperature



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Fig. 4 - Leakage Current vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig. 5 - On-State Current vs. On-State Voltage




Fig. 6 - Output Off Current (Leakage) vs. Voltage




Fig. 7 - Normalized Trigger Input Current vs. Temperature




Fig. 8 - I<sub>FT</sub> vs. Turn-On Time (µs)




Fig. 9 - Normalized I<sub>H</sub> vs. Temperature

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




Fig. 10 - I<sub>FT</sub> vs. LED Pulse Width








Fig. 12 - Shipping Tube Specifications for DIP-6 Packages




Fig. 13 - Tube Shipping Medium





Fig. 14 - Tube Shipping Medium




Fig. 17 - Tape and Reel Packing (1000 pieces on Reel)




Fig. 18 - Wave Soldering Double Wave Profile According to J-STD-020 for DIP Devices




Fig. 19 - Lead (Pb)-free Reflow Solder Profile According to J-STD-020 for SMD Devices

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
